



Primitive Camping

Due to the Carr Fire, the only primitive campgrounds currently open in the park are Horse Camp and part of Peltier Bridge.

Horse Camp may accommodate any tent, vehicle or combination of vehicles, including trailers, RVs, and RVs pulling other vehicles. There is not a length restriction. Sleeping in vehicles is permitted here. Horse Camp has drinking water available from a hand pump.

Peltier Bridge is for tent camping only. There is no drinking water. Sleeping in vehicles is not allowed.

All sites contain a picnic table, a bear-proof storage locker, a fire pit with a swing-arm BBQ grill, and a pole for hanging your lantern. The sites share a vault toilet.

Reservations

Reservations can be made up to 6 months in advance by calling **1-877-444-6777** or using the website www.recreation.gov.

Reservations cannot be made if it is less than 24 hours before your arrival.

If you do not have reservations, inquire at the visitor center about temporary availability.

Fees

The primitive camping fee is \$20.00 per night year round. The following will be honored for a 50% discount: Golden Age and Access Passports and the Interagency Senior and Access Passes.

In addition to the campground fee, an entrance pass must be purchased for the use of the recreation area. Entrance passes can be purchased at the visitor center or online at www>YourPassNow.com or www.recreation.gov.

Primitive Campground Regulations

1. Only six people may stay in one site. Two tents may be erected per site. Any visitors to your site must leave by the 10 PM quiet time.
2. Two vehicles are allowed per site.
3. Check-out time is noon and check-in time is 1:00 pm.
4. Quiet hours are between 10 PM and 6 AM. Loud voices and music are prohibited after 10 PM.

5. Pets must be kept in a cage or on a leash no more than six feet in length at all times. Unattended pets are subject to impoundment and the owners may be issued a notice of violation. Dispose of pet waste in trash cans.
6. Protect our natural resources. Gather only dead and down wood for firewood. Do not put nails in trees or damage or remove vegetation.
7. Do not leave campfires unattended. Always make sure that your fire is completely extinguished before you leave your campsite or before you go to sleep for the night.
8. You may stay a total of 14 days from May 15 through September 15 or a total of 30 days during the entire calendar year.
9. Portable showers are not allowed. From Memorial Day through Labor Day, free cold showers or hot showers for a small fee are available at Oak Bottom Beach.
10. Generators are not allowed.
11. Whiskeytown is black bear country. All food, pet food, beverage containers, cosmetics, toiletries, cooking utensils, dishes, and other items with food odor must be stored inside your bear-proof storage locker or in your vehicle out of sight and odor-free unless they are in immediate use. Never store these items in your tent.
