



Weddings at White Sands



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Congratulations! So you've set a date and would like to take your wedding vows surrounded by the shimmering dunes of White Sands National Monument. We know that you've got a lot to plan, so we've made sure that the process for reserving your wedding day is very simple.

How to Apply for a Permit

All wedding requests go through a permitting process and are approved by the superintendent. This process takes about five business days. You can obtain an application on our website at www.nps.gov/whsa.

information you include on the initial wedding application, the faster your request will be processed. The permit is valid only for the date of your wedding.

The application must contain detailed information on your wedding, such as the expected number of guests and if you will be having music, flowers, candles, tents, awnings, chairs, etc. Large weddings may require you to provide port-a-potties and trash receptacles for your event. The more

There is only one area that you may reserve for your wedding—the Group Use Area. This location is chained-off to restrict access. It requires an additional reservation charge of \$25 per day and per event. You may hold your wedding in other areas within the monument; however, keep in mind that these areas are open to the public.

Application and Other Fees

A \$25 non-refundable fee is required to review and process your permit. The accepted methods of payment are cash, cashier's checks, travelers checks, or money orders *only*. Credit cards and personal or business checks are not accepted.

fee is required if your wedding requires the monument to open early or stay open later than normal hours of operation. The option to open early or stay late depends upon the availability of staff.

Depending on the amount of impact your wedding may cause, additional fees may be required. These fees may include: cost recovery for resource or vegetation damage, traffic control or parking assistance, dumpsters, trash cans, or port-a-potties. A \$50 per hour

Wedding guests entering White Sands for the *ceremony* will not be charged entrance fees. However, if you choose to have a reception or recreational activities before or after the wedding, your guests will be charged an entrance fee of \$5 per person ages 16 and older.

Wedding Planning

Decorations

You may decorate the area for your wedding. For guidance on decorations that are acceptable and those that are not, please see the back of this brochure.

Missile Tests

Missile tests are scheduled anytime from one month to one day in advance and are subject to change,

cancellation, or extension at any time. We recommend you call us two weeks prior to your wedding, as well as both the day before and the day of your wedding to ensure that there are no missile-test closures during your wedding. In case of missile-test interference, you can reschedule your wedding at no extra charge.

Wedding Planning (continued)

Public Facilities

White Sands National Monument does not have any indoor facilities available for public use. There are, however, picnic shelters, grills, and restrooms throughout the dunefield. You may use an RV or other camper as a place for the wedding party to prepare for the ceremony.

Shade

Other than the picnic shelters, there is no shade in the dunefield. You are welcome to set up sun tents and other shelters to provide shade for guests.

Alcohol

Spring break, Easter, spring weekends, and Memorial Day are family times in

the monument. Alcohol is not allowed within park boundaries from February 1st through May 31st.

Water

No water is available in the dunefield. If you need to fill up water containers, you can do so at the visitor center. We recommend having on hand at least a gallon of water per person per day.

Park Map and Directions

A copy of the park map is available on our website at www.nps.gov/whsa and may be downloaded and distributed to guests. Directions to the park are also available on the website.

Getting Your Guests to the Right Place

You are responsible for providing your guests with directions to the location of your wedding. A map of the Dunes Drive will be provided along with your copy of the permit for you to distribute

Acceptable Wedding Decorations

- Silk, dried, or fake flower arrangements; garlands; bouquets; etc. are allowed.
- Kites or pinwheels may be used instead of balloons.
- Candles, torches, and candelabra may be used, but you must pick up all wax and dispose of it outside the monument. You must also bring a fire extinguisher.
- Absolutely no open fires on the sands.
- Bubbles or bells may be used instead of rice.
- Tarps, tents, awnings, canopies, arches, lattice, and columns are allowed as long as they are properly attached to the ground using either ropes or stakes.
- You may use plastic and paper dishware of any color, except in the color white.
- Chairs, tables, red carpets, and runners that do not harm vegetation are fine.
- Motor homes and trailers to be used as dressing rooms, for equipment, and as generators are okay.
- Horses and carriages are okay as long as you follow the monument's rules and regulations regarding the use of these. Horses must be brought in by trailer, and you may get a horse permit at the entrance station. Carriages will only be allowed in designated areas, and they must be brought in by trailer.
- Any other requests not covered here will be dealt with on an individual basis.

Unacceptable Wedding Decorations

- No living plants, live flowers, or plant material of any kind are allowed in the monument due to the risk of harming or contaminating our vegetation with non-native species.
- Balloons of any size, shape, or style are not allowed.
- The throwing of rice, birdseed, confetti, live flower petals, etc., is prohibited.
- Glass bottles, glassware, wine bottles, beer bottles, etc., are not allowed within the monument's boundaries.
