



FOR YOUR SAFETY

Significant areas of the White Sands Missile Range are known to be contaminated with unexploded ordnance (UXO). Other areas are potentially contaminated or occupy safety exclusion zones and may have been contaminated by accident or past testing. All of these areas present a real hazard and you must proceed carefully when in or near any area identified as a hazardous area.



If you see man-made debris anywhere, avoid them. If they look like ordnance items, immediately report them to a Park Ranger. Do not disturb them or the area around them.

This brochure provides you with the phone numbers for White Sands National Monument and Range support activities to call in the event you believe that you have observed or located possible UXO items. Other emergency support phone numbers are provided for your use.

Do not touch any metallic devices or any items such as those pictured in this brochure. They could be dangerous.

All Monument lands, known as the Zone Of Cooperative Use are closed to the public at all times. See map at right.




Missile and Target Debris


Occasionally, missile malfunctions result in test debris outside Range boundaries. Despite extensive efforts to recover these items, it is impossible to locate them all. While it is unlikely you will uncover any test items or missile debris, the possibility does exist. This brochure has been designed to help you recognize types of devices containing explosives that might be found. Some of these devices may be innocent looking metal boxes which actually contain explosives, flares, or detonators. Any of these items, as well as the antipersonnel bomblets, may explode if moved. If you find any debris that looks like an ordnance item, note its location and report it by calling one of the phone numbers provided in this brochure. Personnel from the Range will be summoned to take care of it.








Do Not Touch!



Some explosives may actually look like bombs. Most do not. This is what makes them so dangerous. Only an expert can tell if a piece of missile debris contains explosives or flares.

Explosives come in many shapes, sizes, and colors. Some are hidden in electronic devices and other metal spheres which children might mistake for toy balls. Some are bright and shiny while others are painted or rusted. Equally dangerous are flares, which may have been dropped by planes or helicopters. Flares have the potential of bursting into an instant ball of flame with temperatures of thousands of degrees.

Pictured here are some of the devices which may be found which contain explosives or which can cause severe burns if they ignite. If you enter a remote area, be sure to warn your children and do not allow them to play unsupervised. Some of these items might look like toys to youngsters. Simply rolling them over might cause them to explode.

The bomblets, detonators, flares, shells, and fuses shown here are only a few of the explosives which can cause injury or death.
