**Job Description:** Ideas for specific projects or tasks will be generated after consultation with the management team. Intern will produce several short clips of events or facilities and their interpretive story for YouTube and the web as podcasts from the park. All final scripts will be reviewed and evaluated by the Chief of Interpretation and the Park Superintendent before posting. Some clips will also include an ASL interpreter. The park will provide the staff to narrate or sign. The volunteer must have their own filming/recording and editing equipment. NOTE: Images taken while on NPS time are the property of the NPS. The NPS has final decision as to what portion of products created in the course of the internship will be used. Photographs published under NPS caption and on our web site are public property.

**Benefits to the volunteer:** Personal enrichment and working within a national park setting. Increased ability to think of ways to communicate information to visitors to enhance their understanding of the legacy of the 1848 Woman's Rights Convention and the Declaration of Sentiments.

**Skills and Qualifications:** Videography skills including the ability to lay a music track, caption, and edit B roll or original footage.

**Time Commitment:** Time commitment will vary with topic and script needs, shooting, recording and editing could be two weeks or several months.

**Work Location:** Shooting will be at sites in Seneca Falls or Waterloo, NY. Editing will be done by intern in school labs or on home equipment. Duplication and labeling will be purchased by the park.
