




## How do I Apply?

Each division here at Wrangell St. Elias National Park and Preserve is important and comes with its own variety of tasks and challenges.



However, working with every park division will open your eyes to see how the park operates and the work that these individuals do in order to make your park as great as it is. Although some of the tasks you will be asked to perform will be challenging and require some hard work, the Wrangell-St. Elias National Park Service will be an amazing and exciting experience for you!

**O**rientation: While receiving the orientation, you will get to travel for up to two weeks of the summer. The activities vary from year to year. The 2013 YCC crew traveled on a flight tour of Kennebec, climbed a glacier, went on a wildlife cruise, rafted rivers, and visited other National Parks and public land agencies, such as, Bureau of Land Management.

**E**xotic Plant Management Team: is a function of the Resource Department. Here you will learn about invasive plants that are in Alaska and what you can do to help prevent them from spreading. Also, you will get a chance to work with the Invasive Plants specialists and Resource Management Specialists to learn how to control this problem.

**M**aintenance: Tasks may include painting, planting, up keeping trails, working on signs and campgrounds, constructing buildings, and keeping the area around the park clean and pleasant for visitors to enjoy.

**A**dministration: The employees in administration provide customer service and guidance for the park staff. They act as liaisons between the regional and Washington Offices. Working side by side with an administrative employee you get a hands on experience with what they do.



**I**nterpretation: You will mainly work at the visitor center. While learning how to answer questions that visitors have about the park and surrounding communities. Rewarding but there is a lot of information to learn.
