

Recreational ORV Permit Instructions

IS THIS THE PERMIT I NEED?

A recreational Off Road Vehicle (ORV) user is anyone who uses an ORV to access the park or preserve for recreational activities (including sport hunting) and who is not a federally qualified subsistence user engaged in subsistence activities. If a non-local resident wants to engage in hunting with an ORV, they must obtain a recreational ORV permit. If a local is engaging in non-subsistence recreational ORV use, they must obtain a recreational ORV permit.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR RECREATION ORV PERMITS

1. Download ORV application (form 10-933) from the Recreational ORV [website](#).
2. Complete the application, including **Applicant Information, Vehicle Information, Permit Request Details, and Name, Date, and Signature**.
 - a. In the “Requested Use area or Route” section, select the recreational trail(s) you wish to use this year.
 - b. If the permit will cover more than one ORV, use addendum (last page of application) to add additional vehicles.
3. Email the completed application (form 10-933) to **WRST_Permits@nps.gov** (WRST_Permits@nps.gov). The email subject should say “Recreation ORV Permit.”
4. Permitting staff will process the application. If/when the application is approved, the applicant will receive an email with the *unsigned ORV permit* (form 10-114) attached.
 - a. **Sign and date the permit** (page 1 of form 10-114).
 - b. Designate the **person who is responsible** for adhering to the permit terms and conditions. This can be the permittee or another person. (Condition #12 on page 3 of form 10-114).
 - c. Return the permit to **WRST_Permits@nps.gov** (WRST_Permits@nps.gov).
5. Permitting staff will email the **official (fully executed) NPS-signed permit** to the permittee.
6. The person designated under Condition #12 (and any additional ORV drivers in the party) must **keep the signed ORV permit on their person** (hard copy or digital copy) at all times while operating an ORV on designated trails listed on the permit in Wrangell-St. Elias National Park and Preserve.

NOTES

- Please allow **two weeks processing time** from the date the application is first submitted until an official permit is received.
- The permit is not valid until signed by both the permittee and NPS official.
- Always keep a copy of the permit on your person (hard copy or digital copy).
- The permit is only valid for the year it is issued.

NOTICES

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO APPLICANT

This application does not serve as permission to conduct any special use activity in the Park. The information provided will be used to evaluate whether a permit will be issued. All applicable parts of the form must be completed. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated. Send the completed application to worst_perms@nps.gov. The application must be signed and dated in order for the application to be considered complete.

Purposes The purposes of this application are (1) to provide a National Park Service (NPS) Park Superintendent with information to approve or deny requests for activities that provide a benefit to an individual, group, or organization, rather than the public at large; and (2) to assist Park staff to manage the activity to ensure that the permitted activity does not interfere with the enjoyment of the Park by visitors and that the natural and cultural resources of the Park are protected.

Routine Uses: In addition to those disclosures generally permitted under Title 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(b) of the Privacy Act, records or information contained in this system may be disclosed outside the NPS as a routine use pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(b)(3) to other Federal, State, territorial, local, tribal, or foreign agencies and other authorized organizations and individuals based on an authorized routine use when the disclosure is compatible with the purpose for which the records were compiled as described under the system of records notice for this system

Effects of Nondisclosure: Failure to provide the requested information may impede your ability to obtain a permit from the NPS. The U.S. Criminal Code, Title 18 U.S.C. § 1001, provides that knowingly falsifying or concealing a material fact is a felony that may result in fines of up to \$10,000 or 5 years in prison, or both. Deliberately and materially making false or fraudulent statements on this form will be grounds for denying you a Special Use Permit.

If your request is approved, a permit containing applicable terms and conditions will be sent to you. The permit must be signed by the responsible person and returned to the Park for final approval by the Park Superintendent before the permitted activity may begin.

CUSTOMERS MAKING PAYMENT BY PERSONAL CHECK

When you provide a check as payment, you authorize us either to use information from your check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from your account or to process the payment as a check transaction. When we use information from your check to make an electronic fund transfer, funds may be withdrawn from your account as soon as the same day we receive your payment, and you will not receive your check back from your financial institution.

PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT STATEMENT

We are collecting this information subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act (Title 44 U.S.C. § 3501) to provide the Park Superintendent information needed to evaluate whether a permit will be issued for the requested use. You are not required to respond to this or any other Federal agency-sponsored information collection unless it displays a currently valid OMB control number. The authority to collect information on the attached form is derived from Title 31 U.S.C. § 7701, Taxpayer identifying number, Title 54 U.S.C. § 100101, Promotion and regulation; Title 54 U.S.C. § 100751, Regulations; Title 54 U.S.C. § 103104, Recovery of costs associated with special use permits; and Title 54 U.S.C § 100905 Commercial filming.
