

Dr. Schemske received his PhD from the University of Illinois, was a postdoctoral fellow at the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute, and has held academic positions at Amherst College, The University of Chicago, and University of Washington. He is now Hannah Professor of Biology at Michigan State University, where he holds appointments at Kellogg Biological Station and the Departments of Plant Biology and Horticulture. His research investigates the ecological and genetic mechanisms of adaptation and speciation in plants from temperate and tropical environments.
