What first peoples call Yosemite home?

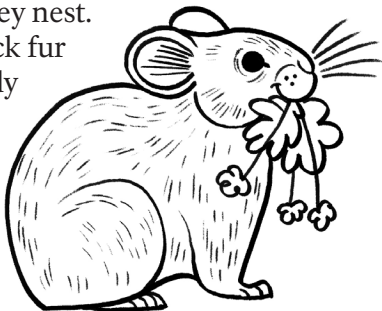
What people first lived on the land you call home?

Before we had grocery stores, the outside world was the supermarket! People traded resources they had for things they needed, such as acorns from Yosemite Valley for obsidian from Mono Lake. What in your home or region could you have traded?

Adaptations are things animals have or do that help them survive where they live, like having flippers to swim or working together to build a nest.

A **pika** is a rabbit-like animal that lives on the highest mountain peaks in Yosemite. It has adaptations to help it survive in this extreme environment. During the short summer season, pika collect grass and flowers to store for winter food in the rock piles where they nest.

They have thick fur and warm body temperatures to survive cold winters.

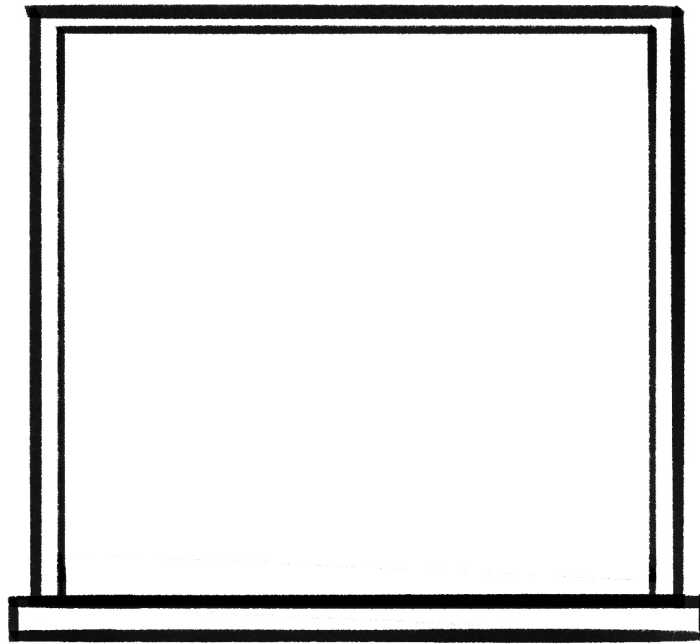

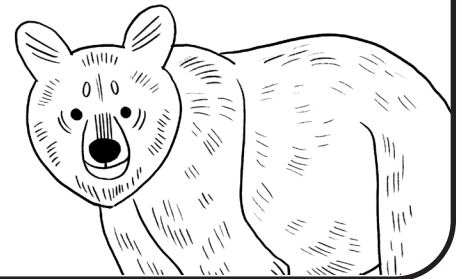
