

🛥 Park Regulations

The National Park Service is dedicated to protecting Yosemite for the benefit and enjoyment of future generations. Regulations are in place to protect both visitors and park resources.

Prohibited activities include:

- Using drones
- Feeding or approaching wildlife
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- Picking up archeological items, such as arrowheads
- Using metal detectors
- Driving vehicles into meadows
- Biking off of paved roads
- Campgrounds Campgrounds
- Possession of weapons inside Pederal facilities
- Possessing or using marijuana, including medical marijuana




You are driving in wildlife habitat. Follow posted speed limits, drive carefully, and watch for animals crossing the road.

Pets are NOT allowed on hiking trails.



Service dogs are allowed anywhere that visitors can go. A service dog is trained to perform a specific task to assist a person with a disability. Emotional support, therapy, and companion animals are all subject to pet regulations.

Things to Know

Expect Yosemite Valley to be busy.

Arrive early to avoid long lines at entrances and to find parking more easily. Park in one of three main Valley parking areas (Curry Village, Yosemite Village, or Yosemite Falls) and walk, bike, or use free shuttles to reach trailheads and other Valley destinations. *Turn to page 6 for a shuttle map.* Sign up for Yosemite traffic alerts by texting ynptraffic to 333111.

Waterfalls may be dry by late summer.

Peak runoff typically happens in May or June, during spring snowmelt. Some waterfalls (including Yosemite Falls) may be only a trickle or completely dry by August.

Be aware of summer thunderstorms.

Check the weather forecast before you go, and pay attention to conditions while hiking. Stay off granite domes and other high-elevation, exposed places during storms, when there is a high risk of lightning strikes. Take shelter in a building or hard-topped vehicle when possible.

It's wildfire season in Yosemite.

Smoke from wildfires inside or outside the park may affect visibility and can pose a health concern, especially for sensitive individuals.

Fires are only allowed in portable stoves, barbecue grills, and **established** fire rings. Never leave a fire unattended; extinguish the fire *completely* before you leave it. Additional fire restrictions may be in effect, depending on conditions.

Visitors can enter Yosemite with a peak-hours reservation OR a wilderness or Half Dome permit OR in-park camping, lodging, or vacation rental OR regional transit or tour group.

It is illegal to approach or feed any wild animal in Yosemite,

including birds and squirrels.



DISTANCE FROM WILDLIFE: 150 feet = about four bus-lengths.

Wildlife can cause injuries and transmit diseases. Human food is unhealthy for wild animals. Animals used to being fed can become dangerous and be killed as a result.

Stay at least 150 ft (46 m) from bears and coyotes.

Stay at least 25 ft (8 m) from all other wildlife.

Keep Bears Wild: Proper Food Storage is Required by Federal Law

To a bear, "food" also includes trash, toiletries, and anything else with a scent. All must be properly stored.

Turing the Day

While hiking or picnicking, always keep your food within arm's reach. When away from your vehicle, lock it and keep all windows closed, with food, drinks, and coolers hidden from sight. Never leave food in a truck bed or strapped to the outside of a vehicle.

🖌 At Night

Bears can easily break into vehicles. **Food, trash, and other scented items may NOT be stored inside vehicles overnight.** These items must be kept inside a food locker or in a hotel room or hard-sided cabin with doors and windows closed. Food may also be stored inside a completely hard-sided RV with all windows and doors closed.

The trip across Tioga Road offers a 39-mile scenic drive past forests, meadows, lakes, and granite domes. Tuolumne Meadows embodies the Sierra Nevada high country, the Tuolumne River winding through domes, peaks, and peaceful meadows. It's also the jumping-off point for many hikes, whether you venture out for a day or a week.

DIRECTIONS 1.5 hours from Yosemite Valley. Drive 16 mi/26 km north on Big Oak Flat Rd to Crane Flat. Turn right onto Tioga Rd. Continue 39 mi/63 km to Tuolumne Meadows.

VISITOR SERVICES

Tuolumne Meadows Visitor Center 9 am – 5 pm

This area of the park is very remote, so plan ahead. Little or no cell service. No gas. Limited services: turn to page 5.

THINGS TO DO

Olmsted Point Stop at this popular roadside overlook with excellent views of Half Dome, Clouds Rest, and Tenaya Lake.

Tenaya Lake Enjoy a picnic, a walk, or a chilly dip in the lake! **Soda Springs** Take a scenic stroll through the heart of Tuolumne Meadows, with views of the river and surrounding domes and peaks.

Enjoy a longer hike in Yosemite Wilderness If you have time, explore one of the many scenic trails in this area! Stop by the Tuolumne Meadows Visitor Center for maps, recommendations, and current trail information.

Walk across the O'Shaughnessy Dam, hike along the reservoir, or access Yosemite's Wilderness. Pick up a free map brochure at the entrance station for information about trails. **Open sunrise to sunset only.**

Swimming and boating are not permitted in the reservoir. Pets are not allowed on the dam or on trails.

DIRECTIONS Located 38 mi (61 km) or 1.5 hours from Yosemite Valley. Take Big Oak Flat Road to the Big Oak Flat Entrance. Just after exiting the park, turn right on Evergreen Road. Follow signs to Hetch Hetchy entrance. *Vehicles and trailers over 25 ft long and 8 ft wide are not permitted on Hetch Hetchy Rd.*



CRANE FLAT

Hike to two quiet sequoia groves near the Big Oak Flat Entrance. **DIRECTIONS** 16 mi/26 km (30 min) from

Yosemite Valley, on Big Oak Flat Road.

THINGS TO DO

Tuolumne Grove of Giant Sequoias Trailhead located on Tioga Rd, just north of Crane Flat. Hike 2 mi/3.2 km (roundtrip) to the grove. Add an optional 0.5-mi/0.8-km loop around the nature trail. Expect a steep climb of 500 ft/150 m on the return to the trailhead.

Merced Grove of Giant Sequoias

A very small and quiet sequoia grove. From the trailhead on Big Oak Flat Rd, hike 3 mi/4.8 km (roundtrip) to the grove. Expect a steep climb of 520 ft/160 m on the return to the trailhead.



GLACIER POINT

Take in stunning views of Yosemite Valley, Half Dome, and the high Sierra.

DIRECTIONS 1 hour from Yosemite Valley. Drive south on Wawona Road for 9 mi/14 km. Turn left onto Glacier Point Road and continue for 16 mi/26 km.

VISITOR SERVICES Limited gifts & snacks. *Turn to page 5.*

THINGS TO DO

Glacier Point Overlook Enjoy spectacular views of the Valley floor, 3,200 ft below, as well as Half Dome and the high Sierra. Paved, wheelchair-accessible path.

Sentinel Dome & Taft Point Starting from the trailhead on Glacier Point Rd, hike 2.4 mi/3.9 km (roundtrip) west to Taft Point, a scenic overlook along the Valley rim. From the same trailhead, hike 1.8 mi/ 3 km (roundtrip) northeast to Sentinel Dome. *Map on page 11*.



WAWONA & MARIPOSA GROVE

Explore giant sequoias, meadows, and the South Fork Merced River near Yosemite's South Entrance.

DIRECTIONS From Yosemite Valley, drive south on the Wawona Rd for 30 mi (48 km), or about one hour.

Yosemite History Center Explore the early days of tourism in Yosemite. Outdoor exhibits open daily.


Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequoias





In Yosemite Valley, use one of three main parking areas: Curry Village (1), Yosemite Village 1, or Yosemite Falls 7. Parking can completely fill by late morning on weekends and holidays. Once you find a parking space, keep it. Walk, bike, or ride a shuttle to trailheads and other destinations.

Park only in designated parking spaces or in a paved turnout, pulled completely off the road. Vehicles parked on vegetation or blocking traffic are subject to citation and may be towed.

So Bicycling in Yosemite

Where to Ride Enjoy several miles of scenic, paved bike paths through Yosemite Valley. Bicycles are also allowed on park roads (cyclists must obey traffic laws.) Bicycles are NOT allowed on hiking trails. The speed limit on bike paths is 15 mph. Helmets are required by law for children under 18.

Rentals Bicycles are available for full-day and half-day rentals (turn to pages 4 & 5 for hours and locations.) Standard adult & children's bikes are first-come, first-served. Bikes with trailers are available at Yosemite Valley Lodge and Curry Village only. ADA bicycles are available by reservation: call 209/372-1208.

Yosemite Bike Share Bikes may be available for 1-2 hour rides. Check goyose.org/bikeshare for information.

E-bikes with two or three wheels, fully operable pedals, and electric motors less than 750 watts (1 horsepower) are allowed everywhere bicycles are allowed.

Bus & Shuttle Service

• Travel to Yosemite via YARTS (\$)

The Yosemite Area Regional Transportation System (YARTS) is a public transit system that provides service into Yosemite. Enjoy yearround service from Merced and seasonal service from Sonora, Mammoth Lakes, and Fresno. Buses are air-conditioned, bike-friendly, wheelchair-accessible, and equipped for rider comfort. 

Repairs in progress on the Mist Trail; follow detour signs to the John Muir Trail (June 30 – October 30; 7 am – 3:30 pm; Monday – Thursday.) The Mist Trail is open Fridays, weekends, and holidays. Repair area and detour shown on map above.

HAPPY ISLES TO VERNAL FALL FOOTBRIDGE (OUT & BACK) 1–1.5 hrs. Hike the short but very steep first section of the John Muir Trail for a view of Vernal Fall from the footbridge. Return the same way. This section of trail is paved, but pets are NOT allowed.

HAPPY ISLES TO TOP OF VERNAL FALL (OUT & BACK) 2-3 hours. Hike the John Muir Trail to the footbridge, then continue onto the Mist Trail. Climb a series of very steep steps to the top of Vernal Fall. This section has heavy spray and slippery steps; wear shoes with good traction and expect to get wet. Return the same way.

HAPPY ISLES TO TOP OF VERNAL FALL (LOOP VIA CLARK PT) 2-4 hours. Hike the John Muir Trail to the footbridge, then continue onto the Mist Trail. Climb a series of very steep steps to the top of Vernal Fall. This section has heavy spray and slippery steps; wear shoes with good traction and expect to get wet. Continue up to Clark Point for more great views of Vernal and Nevada Falls, then enjoy a dry descent to the footbridge.

HAPPY ISLES TO TOP OF NEVADA FALL (OUT & BACK) 4-5 hours. Hike the John Muir Trail to the footbridge, then continue onto the Mist Trail. Climb a series of very steep steps to the top of Vernal Fall. Follow the Mist Trail another steep mile to the top of Nevada Fall. Return the same way.

HAPPY ISLES TO TOP OF NEVADA FALL (LOOP VIA CLARK PT) 4-6 hours. Hike the John Muir Trail to the footbridge, then continue onto the Mist Trail. Climb a series of very steep steps to the top of Vernal Fall. Follow the Mist Trail another steep mile to the top of Nevada Fall. Return via the John Muir Trail and Clark Point.

Even More Challenging Hikes

YOSEMITE FALLS TRAIL 6–8 hrs. A steep, rugged trail with dozens of switchbacks. Hike the first steep mile to 7.2 mi/11.6 km; 2,700 Columbia Rock for stunning valley views. Continue to the top of Yosemite Falls; return the same way.

FOUR MILE TRAIL TO GLACIER POINT 6-8 hrs. This challenging trail offers spectacular views of Yosemite Valley. Plan to hike back down from Glacier Point—there is no shuttle to return you to the Valley. Combine with the Panorama Trail for an even longer 12-mile semi-loop.
