When bringing your group to Zion to volunteer, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

- All groups members will be required to participate in the work project.
- Work may be in extreme desert conditions – hot sun, intense heat, and low humidity. Volunteer should take all necessary safety precautions, including staying well-hydrated and wearing sun protection (SPF lotion, long clothing, hat)
- Field work includes potential exposure to cliffs and unstable terrain, biting insects, wild animals, dermatitis-causing plants, and poisonous snakes. The region experiences frequent thunderstorms, which can produce flash floods--high, exposed areas and narrow canyons should be avoided when storms threaten.
- For the safety of the volunteers, it is strongly recommended that all group members wear long pants and closed-toed shoes.

As I receive applications, I will contact the group leader to begin processing the request and discuss possible projects. A week before the scheduled volunteer project I will send a confirmation email to the group leader with all the necessary information for the group.
