### Zion National Park: Commercial Use Authorizations (CUAs)

#### Commercial Interpretive Services

This CUA allows companies to perform interpretive or instructional services while escorting customers on specific trails within Zion. The park's goal in allowing this service is to provide each visitor with educational and recreational opportunities to foster an appreciation of Zion and its resources.

There are two types of interpretive CUAs:

#### **Level 2 (Large Group)**

Group Size	16 to 50 people, including leader(s)
Entrance Fee	\$80 for vehicles that hold 16-25 passengers \$190 for vehicles that hold 26+ passengers
Allowed Trails	-Angels Landing Trail to Scout Lookout -Court of the Patriarchs -Grotto Trail -Kayenta Trail -Lower and Middle Emerald Pools -Pa'rus Trail -Riverside Walk (paved portion only) -Weeping Rock Trail

#### **Level 3 (Small Group)**

Group Size	15 or fewer people, including leader(s)
Entrance Fee	\$12 per person Annual and lifetime federal recreational lands passes are accepted
Allowed Trails	-Angels Landing Trail -Canyon Overlook Trail -Court of the Patriarchs -Grotto Trail -Kayenta Trail -Lower, Middle and Upper Emerald Pools -Narrows to but not into Orderville Canyon (1.5 miles north of Riverside Walk) -Pa'rus Trail -Riverside Walk -Sandbench Trail (November to March) -Timber Creek Trail -Watchman Trail -Weeping Rock Trail -Weeping Rock Trailhead to Observation Point -Weeping Rock Trailhead to mouth of Echo Canyon (not into canyon) -Weeping Rock Trailhead to mouth of Hidden Canyon (not into canyon)

#### Notes:

- Large groups may not split into smaller groups in order to go on Small Group trails.
- No trails on the Kolob Terrace Road are permitted for CUA groups.
- Only one group per company is allowed on a trail at one time.
- Groups are required to carry a copy of the CUA with them at all times.

#### Shuttle Service, Bicycle Tours

The shuttle service CUA allows companies to pick up and drop off passengers within Zion. The bicycle tour CUA allows companies to escort groups of bicyclists on specific roads within Zion. The entrance fee for both is \$12 per person; annual and lifetime federal recreational passes are accepted.
