Check out time is 11:00 am Mountain Time

Late Check In

Site reservations are site specific. Please do not choose a site other than the site you reserved with recreation.gov


1. Locate your reserved site on the map.
2. Proceed to your site.
3. Return to kiosk by 9:00 am to check in

Check Out

4. Drop post tag in mailbox on final departure.
5. Any questions, see Ranger or Camp Host

Important

- No tree tents allowed in campground
- Hammocks must hang over footprint of the campsite.
- Store all food in hard sided containers or in a vehicle and NOT in your tent.



Utah is in the Mountain Time Zone
California and Nevada are in the Pacific Time Zone, one hour earlier than Utah. Arizona is in the Mountain Time Zone, but does not observe daylight-saving time.



South Campground Regulations

Reservations for the summer season (early March through October) can be made at www.recreation.gov, or by calling 1-877-444-6777. Winter season (December through February) sites are first come first serve.

Camping Etiquette

- *Check out time is 11:00 a.m. Mountain Time.*
- Quiet hours are 10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Generator use is only allowed from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Do not move picnic tables.
- Tents, vehicles, and hammocks must remain within campsite boundaries and cannot be on vegetation.

Campground Use Limits

- *6 occupants per site, including children.*
- 2 vehicles per site, including trailers, or 4 motorcycles. Only one motorhome or camping trailer may occupy the same site.
- 2 tents per site, not on vegetation.
- Length of stay is limited to 14 days total from March through October.

Vehicle Parking

- ALL vehicles, including trailers, must be kept on designated parking areas, not on vegetation.
- Overflow parking is available near the Nature Center near the entrance to the campground.

Food Storage and Sanitation

- *Food must be stored in a vehicle or a hard-sided lockable container. Feeding wildlife is strictly prohibited.*
- Black water must be disposed of at the dump station, not on the ground, in the river, or in irrigation ditches.
- Do not leave trash unattended. Dispose of trash in dumpsters. Leave campsites free of litter.
- Bathing and washing of food, clothing, or dishes at public faucets or in restrooms is prohibited.
- Used dishwater must be dumped down the drains near the water spigots outside each restroom.
- Showers and laundry are available in the town of Springdale for a fee.

Fires and Firewood

- *Wood gathering is prohibited in the park. Wood is available for purchase in Springdale.*
- Fires are only allowed in fire grates at each site. Do not leave fires unattended.
- During fire restrictions, check with a park ranger or a camp host for additional information.
- Fireworks are prohibited in Zion National Park.

Pets

- Pets must be restrained at all times. Leashes must be no longer than six feet in length.
- Hiking with pets is allowed only on park roads and the Pa'rus Trail.
- Do not leave pets unattended.
- Pet owners are responsible for picking up and properly disposing of pet excrement.

Recreation Equipment

- *Hammocks are only allowed within campsite boundaries. They cannot hang over vegetation.*
- Bicycles are allowed on the paved Pa'rus Trail and park roads.
- In-line skates and non-motorized scooters are allowed only on the campground roads and the Pa'rus Trail.
- River tubing and skateboarding are prohibited in the park.
- Clotheslines may be no longer than 15 feet and are restricted to one clothesline per site.
- Installation of sports equipment such as horseshoe pits and stakes, volleyball nets, etc. is prohibited.
- Attaching items to trees with nails, wire, or chains is prohibited.
- Attaching or suspending any item from trees which may cause tree or limb damage, including swings, candles, tree tents, and lanterns, is prohibited.
- Use of OHVs and ATVs is prohibited.
