



Weddings at Zion National Park (updated July 2026)

Zion is a marriage of light and stone, desert, and water, ancient and contemporary. It inspires awe and re-quires contemplation. The serenity of the park affects all who take the time to wonder. Weddings at Zion are small affairs conducted amidst the natural beauty of one of the jewels of our nation. Lovers of nature and beauty may choose this place to wed because they are drawn by the splendor and natural silence of this majestic landscape.

A permit is required to hold a wedding ceremony, elopement, or vow exchange/renewal in the national park. Follow the guidelines outlined here to ensure that your Special Use Permit is in place in time for your special occasion. Please note that third party applications (photographers, wedding planners, etc.) are not accepted.

Application A Special Use Permit is required for any ceremony in the park including a wedding ceremony, elopement, or vow exchange/renewal. The couple requesting the event MUST submit the application on their own behalf.

For a simple ceremony in an authorized area, the application and application fee of \$100 must be received **at least three weeks** prior to the requested date. Until a Special Use Permit is approved and issued, the requested date and location cannot be guaranteed. Please DO NOT send requests for availability prior to submitting an application and paying the application fee.

Your application fee includes the initial two hours spent on your application including administrative costs incurred to communicate with applicants, park staff, etc. Additional fees will be incurred for any additional time necessary at the rate of \$50 per hour. Monitoring fees of \$50 per hour per monitor (including travel time to permit location) may also be incurred, depending on location and complexity. Monitors are typically required for any approved wedding permit that is complex in nature, large group size or is held

in a location where there is a concern of impacts to visitors or resources.

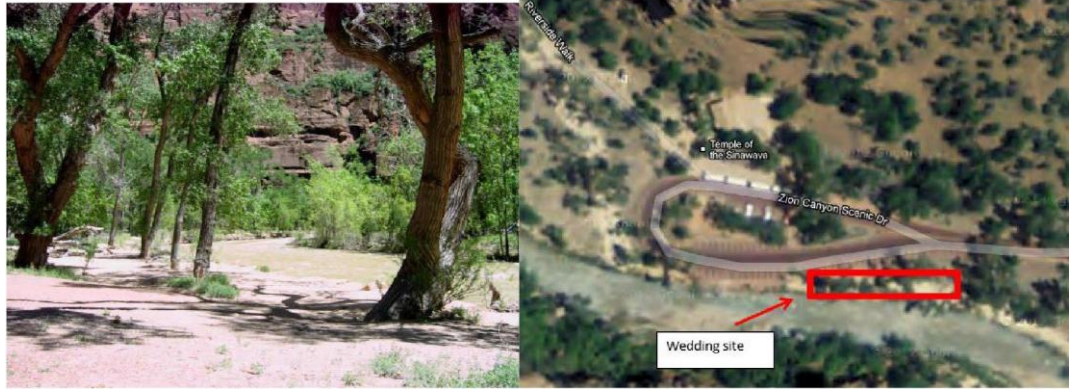

Locations

The location you choose may depend on the size of your group. No wedding permits will be approved for any group larger than 100 people (infants included), and some sites have further restrictions. Permits WILL NOT be approved for any other area than those described below. Also keep in mind that these are public areas and the park will not exclude or allow you to exclude other park visitors from the site during your ceremony.

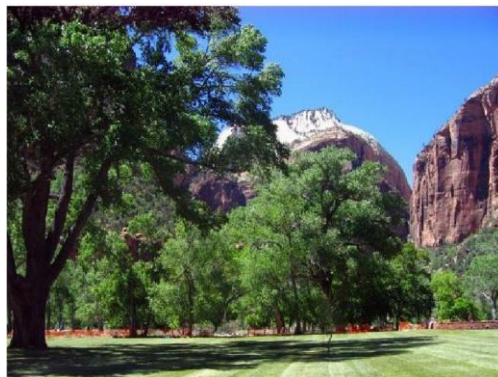
Temple of Sinawava [Maximum of 35 people]

Sample Terms & Conditions

1. This permit does not guarantee exclusive use of an area. The area will remain open to the public during park visiting hours. Permit activities will not unduly interfere with other park visitors' use and enjoyment of the area. Visitors will be allowed to watch the wedding ceremony and activities.
 2. Activities will be spot checked by NPS personnel for compliance with the terms and conditions of the permit and to ensure that no resource damage is occurring.
 3. No physical changes may be made to environment.
 4. Foot travel will be restricted to identified sites.
 5. Any decorations will need prior approval.
 6. Throwing of confetti, rice, birdseed and similar items is prohibited.
 7. Releasing birds, butterflies, or other animals is prohibited.
 8. Access to visitors may not be blocked or impeded by wedding activities. Use may be monitored for compliance.
 9. Vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas.
 10. Zion Canyon Scenic Drive is closed to vehicles March through November and selected dates during the holiday season. Dates subject to change. Access to this area is by shuttle bus only.
 11. Use of any Zion Lodge facility requires prior approval from Lodge management. Please call Zion Lodge 435-772-7752.
 12. Any trash must be removed from the area at the completion of the event.
 13. No public address system or amplified music is permitted: (Re: 36CFR 2.12). Noise levels must not exceed normal speaking volumes.
 14. Compliance with all terms and conditions of the National Park Service Special Use Permit and any additional instructions required by the NPS is mandatory.
 15. Electrical power will not be furnished, nor will generators be allowed.
 16. Erecting of banners, signs, etc. is prohibited.
 17. Food service is prohibited.
 18. Vehicles entering the park for the wedding are subject to the entrance fee. Additional information on park entrance fees available by visiting: <https://www.nps.gov/zion/planyourvisit/fees.htm>
 19. Chairs are permitted at Temple of Sinawava, Lodge Lawn and Nature Center North Lawn not to exceed the number of people permitted at respective site. During the Shuttle operation season (roughly March-November), chairs must be folding chairs as regular chairs cannot be accommodated on the shuttle bus. Special permission to drive to event locations to deliver chairs will not be permitted.
 20. The use of 25 chairs is permitted on the Nature Center Lawn only if the chairs do not require penetrating the grass (e.g. straight legged chairs).
 21. Live plants and/or small flower arrangements are permitted provided that neither live plant nor flower arrangements contain any seed pods whether dried or live.
 22. Arches, altars, arbors, etc., are not permitted with some exception at the South Campground Amphitheater.
